MARCH 10TH...A DAY FOR REMEMBERING WHY WE ARE CALLED CLELIAN HEIGHTS... March 10th is a memorable day for the Apostles of the Sacred Heart of Jesus since it is the birthday of Servant of God, Mother Clelia

Merloni their foundress. Thus, it is also a special day for the Clelian Heights Family, too. Mother Clelia had tremendous love and compassion for children with special needs, and urged her Sisters to look after them as Christ would. That is why our school is called Clelian Heights! It is to honor Mother Clelia and to keep her spirit, memory and good works alive. The Apostles of the American Province were the first to open such a school and God has blessed us for it.

Mother Clelia was born on March 10, 1861 in Viareggio, Italy. When she was 33 years of age, she founded our Congregation - The Apostles of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. In 1902 she sent the first group of sisters as missionaries to the United States. Here, they were to bring God's message of love to the many immigrants entering the country. The Congregation flourished rapidly as many schools were established across the nation. Among them was Clelian Heights, founded in 1961 on the 100th anniversary of Mother Clelia's birth. Since then Clelian Heights has served God's special people as an example of the love, dedication and faith that Mother Clelia left to her sisters as their spiritual legacy.

The Sisters' motto, *The Love of Christ Impels Us*, is our incentive to follow Jesus in bringing love, compassion and hope to those we serve. Thus, Mother Clelia's spirit lives on in us. We hope and pray that in the near future the Church will publicly recognize her Sainthood. Let us call upon her daily asking for her protection over our Clelian Heights family of children, parents, staff, friends and benefactors. She will never let us down!
