Clelian Heights Turns 50... 2011 marks the 50<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the founding of Clelian Heights School for Exceptional Children. Opening its doors in 1961,

Clelian Heights has been serving children and adults with Intellectual and Developmental **Disabilities** for 50 years. Founded by a community of religious Sisters known as the Apostles of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, the mission of Clelian Heights is to provide spiritual, educational, vocational, residential programs for children and adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities that enhance the quality of life and maximize their potential for independent living. In 1961, this began with a staff consisting of four Sisters and a student body close to that number. Today, Clelian Heights touches the lives of over 190 students and adults from 8 counties and 21 school districts in Western Pennsylvania. Providing the same individual attention and instruction for the students and clients as in 1961, Clelian Heights now has a staff of over 125 **professionals**. Winter Weather... We have certainly had our share of school delays and cancellations during the month of January. Hopefully the worst is behind us! However, since



the students at Clelian Heights School belong to many different School Districts, we ask that during inclement weather you follow your home districts. But please also be aware of the possibility that Clelian Heights might have a delay or closing that may not align with your District. Check WTAE, KDKA, and WPXI for all delays and closings. For Buses and parents that transport their children, drop off time for a two-hour delay is between 10:30 am and 10:45 am. Because our staff also comes from the same surrounding areas, we are unable to cover your child any earlier than 10:30 am.

Students from Clelian Heights prepare to take the PASA... The Pennsylvania Alternate System of Assessment (PASA) is a statewide alternate assessment designed for students with Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities. Specifically, intended for those who are unable to participate meaningfully in the Pennsylvania System of School Assessment (PSSA) even with accommodations. By administering the PASA to students with disabilities. schools achieve compliance with federal laws and the Pennsylvania School Code that require that all students participate in the statewide accountability system.

The PASA is an individually administered test given each spring to students by their teacher or another certified Test Administrator who knows the student well. Test administration can be adapted so that even students with the most severe disabilities can participate in the assessment and receive a score. The test, administered to students in the equivalent of grades 3 through 8 and 11, consists of 25 test items related to reading standards; 25 test items

related to math standards; and, for students in grades 4, 8, and 11, approximately 25 test items related to science standards. Each test item represents an authentic, relevant, and ageappropriate skill related to reading, mathematics, or science. There are three levels of difficulty for each content area. Level A contains the least complex reading-, math-, or science-related skills. Level B consists of intermediate skills, and Level C consists of the most complex skills. Like the PSSA, the PASA is designed to take a snapshot of students' typical performance on a small sample of academic skills derived from the PA Academic Standards.

Student performance is recorded via video or narrative notes and submitted for scoring to the contractor at the University of Pittsburgh. Teams of scorers (comprised of practicing teachers, administrative school personnel, college/university faculty) are trained to use a scoring rubric to evaluate student performance. Once scoring has been completed, aggregated results are submitted to the state for inclusion with scores from the PSSA. In addition, PASA reports are generated at the state, home district, service provider, and student levels. This year, the PASA will be administered from February 14th to March 25th at Clelian Heights
